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# Message from our Campus Principal



Welcome back to another year of learning!

We have hit the ground running this year, navigating the ins and outs of the new requirements of Covid and ensuring that we keep our staff and students as safe as possible. Whilst cases were inevitable this year, I'm pleased to report that they have been absolutely minimal in the circumstances and I am reassured that our staff and students are as safe as they can be. We were pleased to have our air purifiers delivered over the holidays and have them installed in most classrooms and common spaces. Our classrooms are

being well ventilated and our students have been working together safely. Thanks to all our families for your support in administering the RAT tests now that they are available and ensuring that your children are away from school when they show signs of illness. The support from our community has been phenomenal this year.

We were really pleased to take possession of two new portable classrooms over the holidays. Since the plans were developed for our new buildings, we have already shown growth in numbers sufficient for the provision of more classrooms. Murphy and my role this year is Campus Assistant Principal and the Year 7 and 8 Sub-School Leader. I will be your primary contact with any and all communication for Year 7 and 8 students. I will endeavour to make 2022 the best school learning year I can make it and if there is anything I can do to help our students please do not hesitate to contact me.

It has been absolutely fantastic to see students settling in (or back in) to our Kurnai Learning Community. We have had a great start to the year, with all Year 7 and 8 students engaged in the classroom and our teachers are acknowledging these positive behaviours with record numbers of green positive write up across all our form groups.



The learning in our core and practical classes have been aimed at bridging any key skills that may have been missed over the last two years of interrupted learning as well as really

extending our students that have excelled in this challenging time. Our targeted reading program, TR@K, is in full swing with all students (Year 7 – 9) placed in classes according to their ability levels and working hard at increasing their phonetic reading ability. This is a key focus for the College and the results of this program in recent years speak for its value.



As a Year 7 and 8 Team, we have started educating our students on our key foci for 2021 through assemblies and promotion around the school. These foci are important areas identified by the staff and students and they cover a range of areas including, but not limited to, Attendance, School Wide Positive Behaviour Data

(SWPBS) and NAPLAN.

### **Attendance**

We are already pushing as another major focus for the year, holding students accountable for being at school all day every day. At our last Year Level Assemblies for Year 7 and 8 we talked about students achieving 95% attendance.


