#### Return to school for 2022

Students are settling into the school routine and have been highly engaged in their classes.







#### **Uniform Expectations**

If students arrive at school, out of uniform, without a note, they will be required to change into school supplied uniform for the day and complete a detention at recess. If your child is out of uniform, please provide a signed note, which explains why your child is not wearing uniform on a particular day. Your child will still be required to change into supplied school uniform but will not be required to complete a detention.

#### Lockers

This year, the lockers are along the drama/woodwork corridor. This area will be unlocked at 8.00am each morning, which gives students 25 minutes to collect their books for the first two periods before the morning bell goes at 8.25am.

#### Form group and TR@K

Each Monday – Thursday, all students will begin period 3 with a 15-minute Form Group or Assembly. We have a Year level assembly on Tuesdays. This will take place in the Library and starts at 11.00am. Form Group takes place on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. It is during this time that the students are provided with any information about the school day and where permission forms are handed out. The students then move to their TR@K classes.

#### **Student Laptops**

A reminder that students are expected to have a charged laptop and that students need to bring their laptop to all classes. Staff in the Year 8 team will be working to determine which students have their own laptop. If parents and guardians could support the school by checking that their child is taking their *charged* laptop to school with a charger that would assist with trying to develop good organisational habits.

#### **Swimming Try outs**

The school Swimming TryOuts will take place on **Thursday, 17th of February** at the Moe swimming pool. This is an opt-in event. Students can sign up on the Year 8 noticeboard in the library foyer. This day is a normal school day for students who are not participating in the swimming events.


We will be available in class and in the yard and will value any ideas that you want to share with us. We will always listen and take everyone's ideas into account. We are here to represent you.



#### Year 10 is the year of endless opportunities.

Term 1 will focus on supporting students to explore and prepare themselves for work experience (more details below).

Term 2 is when students will spend two weeks in their work placements. Work experience will run from *Monday 16th to Friday 27th May*. Term 2 will also be where students start exploring and choosing their preferred pathway for 2023 (Course Counselling).

Term 3 will see our '2022 Trip to Tassie' camp which is a highlight for many and great way to make memories of the year. Excursion forms and further information will come out shortly. While in Term 4, students who nominated to enrol in a VET course for 2023 will complete an orientation day at the TAFE campus for their chosen VET course. ### Changes to how we teach Maths

In Year 10 we take a different approach to setting up our Year 10 Mathematics classes. Before students commence a new topic they will be screened for their prior knowledge of that topic, and be placed in with students who are at a similar level. This will enable the targeted teaching to be focused, allowing students to experience significant growth from their current level, rather than achieving some or no growth. All students, including those in ALPS, will be grouped according to their screener outcome. Groups will change from time to time according to future screeners.

Starting in February and running through to April, AFL Victoria will be providing girls aged between 7-14 with the opportunity to experience female-only footy. With over 10 locations across Gippsland, girls will be able follow the roadshow and attend as many training sessions as they'd like. The events will go for roughly 1 and a half hours where they will learn the basic skills of AFL like kicking & handballing but more importantly, will walk away with a
