

'DOING MY BEST ON THE NAPLAN TEST'

The National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy will take place in the middle of next term from May 11-20. All tests will be completed online this year. There will be practise tests in March and April for students to become familiar with the online process. In order for students to showcase what they can do; teachers will be building on skills and strategies that will help them get ready for the tests.

This is not about "teaching to the test", but it is about teaching transferable skills to other more important assessments and tests, including classwork, Learning Tasks, Common Assessment Tasks (CATs), VCE exams, and more general things like aptitude tests for apprenticeships and other career pathways.

Congratulations to the 47 students from our total of 76 who scored over 3.5 out of 4. They showed skill in submitting work on time, completing class work either in full or to a negotiated standard, on time to class and works respectfully with others. Homegroup sessions have been supporting students address these areas. The next LBUs will be important for measuring student improvement and the impact of strategies over the term.



We have rocked it out in an hour




Art

School Nurse Update

Hearing Tests

Kurnai College is offering hearing tests utilising the hearing screening App Sound Scouts. The App has been developed by Sound Scouts HQ in collaboration with Australia's National Acoustic Laboratories, the research arm of Australian Hearing and is supported by the Department of Health.

Your child will play a game on an iPad/tablet or smart phone using a set of headphones under the supervision of a responsible adult. A report will be automatically generated following the test. Hearing assessment is encouraged due to the importance of early intervention of hearing issues. Optimal educational outcomes are dependent on good hearing.

NewAccess is available through Wellways across Gippsland, providing free and confidential mental health coaching.

The program provides a great starting point for people feeling stressed, anxious, or overwhelmed about everyday life issues.

It is available for people living and working in the Gippsland region who are 12 years old and over.

NewAccess coaches are trained in low-intensity Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, guiding participants through a tailored six session program. This can be delivered via telehealth or face 2 face.
